Common sense still needs to prevail: Parents are asked to drop off and pick up students in a timely manner to avoid any large gatherings. Please take note of your child's collection times. Parents are not encouraged to enter the school site earlier than necessary.

Parents/guardians are not allowed into the classrooms (state wide requirement).

Maintain social distance from other parents and students. Parents are not allowed to hug other people's children, even though they know the children. NO CONTACT.

Students will maintain the high levels of hygiene that we have had in place since the start of COVID 19.

Sick children are not allowed to enter the school because of the danger of cross infection. Students who are displaying flu like symptoms like coughing, sneezing, sore throats and runny noses should be kept at home until well. Children who attend school unwell will be sent home.
